This course examines recent legal trends narrowing <u>the scope of qualified immunity</u>, emphasizing accountability, de-escalation, and leadership in modern policing. Participants will engage with case studies, legal frameworks, and best practices to navigate emerging judicial expectations.

Topics Covered: 1. Federal and state laws governing use-of-force, **2.** Supreme Court rulings shaping use-of-force policies **3.** connecting leadership principles to use-of-force decision-making, **4.** Apply in real-world policing Case law analysis: Application and consequences, Leadership's role in ensuring legal compliance

Ethical Relationships in Use-of-Force Scenarios -3hrs. (CPT pending)

Learning Objectives: **1.** Define <u>"reasonable force"</u> and distinguish it from excessive force. **2.** Strengthen ethical decision-making in critical incidents. **3.** Building trust in police-public interactions through ethical enforcement. **4.** Recognize leadership's role in accountability and relationship dynamics.

Topics Covered: 1. The concept of <u>"reasonable force" vs. excessive force</u> **2.** Leadership and ethical considerations in critical incidents. **3.**Relationship dynamics: Employers, employees, and the public wellbeing **4.** Building trust through ethical enforcement

(Each syllabus builds on the previous one, creating a learning pathway from <u>leadership fundamentals to legal considerations and Ethical implementation.)</u>
